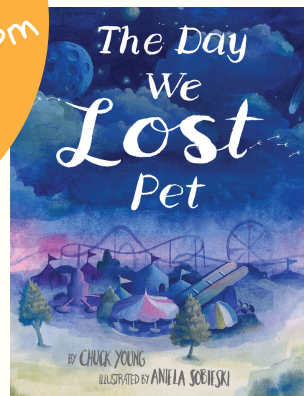
Our first title went on sale in October 2016. Fourteen months and seven books later, this small press is creating big conversations between kids and their adults!

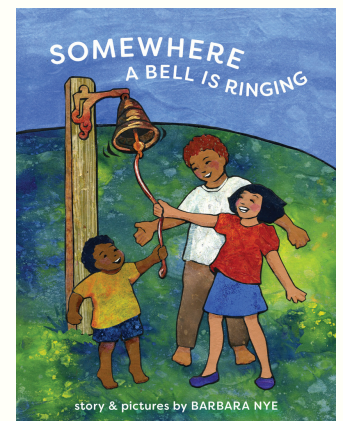

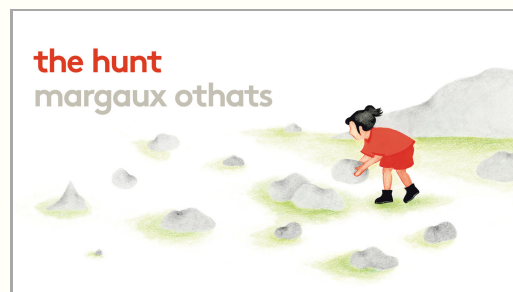
Somewhere a Bell is Ringing, written and illustrated by Barbara Nye.

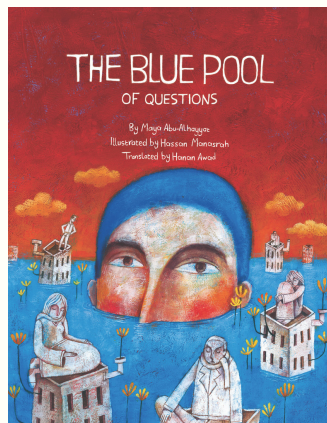


The Hunt by Margaux Othats

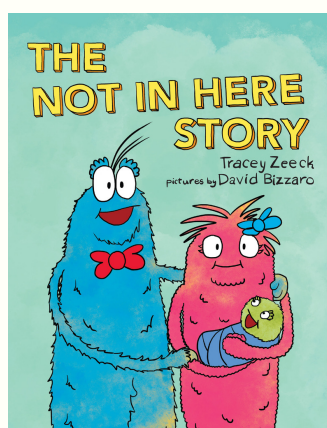

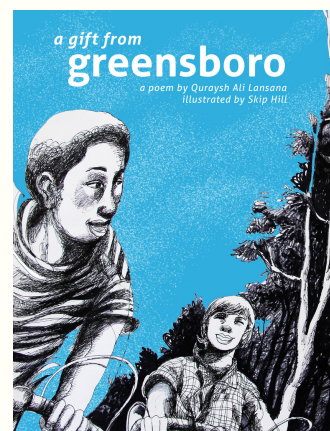
